A Touching Farewell

Antonian Expresses Gratitude to Archbishop Emeritus Patrick Flores

As one of his last engagements, Archbishop Emeritus Patrick Flores accepted an invitation from Antonian to join the student body in an assembly in his honor held on the morning of Tuesday, February 8, 2005. Complete with a mariachi serenade, the gathering was a farewell and an offering of gratitude for the many years of service to the San Antonio

community, and more specifically to the Antonian community.

The assembly began with Flores, Sr. Barbara Neist, SSND, Associate Superintendent of the San Antonio Catholic school system, Gilbert Saenz, Principal of Antonian, Deacon Joseph Hilbert of the Antonian faculty, Joshua L.

Sandoval, Antonian senior and Student Council President, and Antonian junior and mariachi singer Justine Ozuna processing through the aisles of the school auditorium to a standing ovation by the students and faculty. Once the party reached the stage, Deacon Hilbert offered a prayer that through

the intercession of our most blessed Lady of Guadalupe, Archbishop Emeritus Flores be kept "...healthy, happy and in peace as he begins his retirement."

After mariachis played *Mi Virgencita*, Mr. Saenz introduced Miss Ozuna who then serenaded Flores with *Los Laureles*. Following the serendade, Mr. Saenz introduced Mr.

Sandoval who presented Flores with a copy of Antonian's 2004 yearbook, *Warrior*, which was dedicated to Flores for his years of support of the school.


Sandoval spoke, "In 1964, the Archdiocese, in conjunction with the north side parishes decided that a Catholic High School would be built on the

north side of San Antonio. The school was to be known as Antonian College Preparatory High School, its colors would be red, white, and Columbian blue and its mascot would be the Apaches. This school was born in 1964 and graduated its first class in 1968. This was many years before most of us were born. However, many of our

fathers attended this school and prayed for the day when their children would also attend. Years later when Antonian was hurting for enrollment and many wondered if it would close, you came to our rescue and proclaimed that Antonian would continue and that it would become coeducational."

"The courage you showed and the belief you had in our fathers is something for which we will forever be grateful. And in the years since, you have loved us, cared for us and have been a part of our growth and success. And for this reason, we have dedicated our yearbook to you. Our school yearbook

is titled – The Warrior. It is a name fitting of our book but more importantly, it is a title fitting of you as one who cared and loved us as our father. We stand today as a sign of respect and love for you as your children and in honor of their father. For this reason and on the occasion of the completion of your ministry as Archbishop of San Antonio - by the authority

- Wesley Michael Bell (Fr.), who played Ernie and the younger George Bailey in The Magik Theatre's rendition of It's a Wonderful Life in December, will be performing in Dear Edwina! with the S.T.A.R.Z. Youth Performance Troupe of the Barshop Jewish Community Center in late May.
- In the upperclassmen division at the St. Anthony High School speech tournament earlier this semester, Danielle Steele (Jr.) won second place and Armando Perez-Gea (Jr.) placed third.
- Joseph Biediger (Sr.) has completed the impressive feat of earning all 120 merit badges available to Scouts. Joseph, who became an Eagle Scout four years ago, is only the third scout in the Alamo Area Council to have achieved this.
- Alex Cantu (Jr.) received the South Texas "Youth Referee of the Year" award. Alex competed against 3,000+ referees across south Texas.




