Will's Scouting career began under the leadership of Lorraine Knox, Janet Favaro



and Maria Frank as a Cub Scout with Pack 307. He joined Boy Scout Troop 49 in 2005. He has served as Patrol Leader, Senior Patrol Leader, Den Chief and Troop Bugler. In 2008 Will was elected to the Order of the Arrow, S couting's National Honor Society, and in 2010 was promoted to the Brotherhood Rank. In 2009 Will graduated from the National Youth Leadership Training Center in Rochester, N.Y.

Will's outdoor Scouting experiences include four summers at Camp Turrell, an Adirondack canoe trek at Floodwood Mountain Scout Reservation, three high adventure visits to Sea Base in Florida — one with Mahwah Troop 259 on a fishing expedition at the Britton Environmental Center, the second with Troop 49 for coral reef sailing and a third with Troop 79 out of Minneapolis for scuba diving in the Florida Keys.

Will has attended two New Jersey State Police Camporees where he met with Chief Scout Executive Robert Mazzuca. He helped Scouts from Troop 49 host a table for the Gold Star

Mothers Dinner honoring mothers who have lost their sons in combat. Will attended the 100th Anniversary Boy Scout National Jamboree in 2009 at Fort Hill Military Base in Virginia. This past summer, Will joined the Washington, D.C., Boy Scout Council on a trip to Rinkaby, Sweden, to attend the 2011 World Scout Jamboree.

His Eagle service project was designing and constructing a youth area at the Oakland Public Library. Working with the Library Board and the Friends of the Oakland Public Library, Will organized the construction of a multi-purpose youth space. This included replacing all the furniture, installing a multimedia station, new audio-visual equipment and a custom art display system. A special paint scheme was used representing Valley Middle School, Ramapo High School and Indian Hills High School. In excess of 270 hours where spent by Scouts completing the project.

Prior to the ceremony, Will was honored by St. Alban's Episcopal Church for his years of service by renaming one of their outreach programs "WILLing a Difference in Our Community."

Will earned all 131 Boy Scout Merit Badges in the course of his Scouting career, although only 21 are needed to achieve the rank of



Eagle Scout. He also earned his Bronze, Gold and Silver Eagle Palms, which are steps above Eagle. In addition, he earned the 50 Mile Trail Patch, the Historical Trail Patch for hiking over 300 Miles of historic trails in the New Jersey section of the Appalachian Trail, the World Conservation Award, Kayaking BSA Award, Scuba BSA Award, Snorkeling BSA Award, and the International Scout Award.

Will earned the National Outdoor Award including Camping Award with Gold Device, Aquatics Award with Gold and Silver Devices, Riding Award with Gold Device, and Adventure Award with Gold Device. He is a member of the National Eagle Society.

Will recently won the Arthur M. & Brenda King Eagle Scout Scholarship Award for the State of New Jersey and has advanced to the national competition.
