Guardian Ad Litem needs more volunteers

SIX MILE—Louise Cooper, director of the S.C. Guardian Ad Litem program, came to Monday night's annual meeting of the Pickens County Legislative Delegation with one message: "We need more volunteers."

The meeting was held in the family life building of Six Mile Baptist Church.

Guardian Ad Litem volunteers are court-appointed to represent the best interest of children in family court proceedings involving accusations of abuse or neglect. Last year more than 1,800 volunteers worked with the program statewide, representing 5,000 case involving more than 8,000 children. The workers totaled more than 89,365 hours of volunteer hours.

Cooper said she could not begin to describe how much the program depends upon its volunteers, and the wonderful job they do. However, they are always needed additional help.

Beginning July 1, Guardian Ad Litem's need for new volunteers will become more acute. Due to a state supreme
