### School Night Coming to an Elementary School Near You!

During the months of August and September, the Heart of America Council will conduct its new "School Night for Scouting" Fall Round-Up program in a manner that will positively affect more youth, families, schools and communities than ever before.



Some of the benefits your Cub Scout pack will enjoy with the new School Night plan are:

- More boys will join.
- More parents will be recruited to serve as leaders.
- Your leaders will be trained in their new positions right away.
- Your new Cub Scouts and their families can participate in a top-notch overnight family camping activity right away.

Here are some specific components you can also expect from this year's School Night:

- A visit to every school superintendent and elementary school principal by your BSA staff to rollout the plan.
- A "Boy Talk" in every possible elementary school classroom where we are allowed to conduct them. These classroom visits to potential Cub Scouts are:
  - o Scheduled and implemented by your local BSA staff.
  - o Conducted the day before the actual School Night.
  - o Opportunities to send a School Night flyer home with each boy.
- "School Nights" organized and run by district-wide volunteer teams at every elementary school and include:
  - o A district volunteer Coordinator to run that night's program.
  - o A uniformed district volunteer Organizer who works with the participating pack(s) and assigns the boys to the packs and dens.

### Lee's Summit Boy Scout Earns 121 Merit Badges

On Monday, March 27, 2006 at Lee's Summit Christian Church, Eagle Scout, Austin Marlin, received his 121st merit badge out of 120. He earned both Nuclear Science and Atomic Energy as Nuclear Science replaced Atomic Energy to accomplish this goal.

Austin is a member of Boy Scout Troop 1220 in Lee's Summit, Missouri and a Junior at Lee's Summit North High School. He aspires to go to West Point for his

future education and hopes his background as an Eagle Scout will assist in this endeavor. He currently has three Bronze, three Gold and two Silver Palms which are awarded for earning the additional merit badges. Austin received his Eagle in December of 2003 which requires a minimum of 21 merit badges and then proceeded to earn the remaining 100 during the last two years. This put into practice the life skill of goal setting and achievement that young people learn as they participate in Scouting advancement programs.

As a Scout, Austin has demonstrated his leadership ability as a Patrol Leader, Assistant Patrol Leader, Troop Scribe, Troop Quartermaster and currently serves as a Troop Instructor working with new Scouts helping them learn their basic skills.

Other highlights includes his trips to Okpik the Northern Tier High Adventure winter program in Northern Minnesota, the Dou-

- o Adult leader recruitment. Before we even accept the youth applications, we'll ensure every den has the necessary leadership.
- o Youth and adult leader application forms and registration fees collected that night and officially registered right away with the BSA.
- Cub Scout Leader Training
  - o Implemented by district training teams.
  - o Conducted in every district, every Saturday (and in some cases on weeknights) during the month of September.
  - o Aimed at training new leaders right away.
- Cub Scout Family Campouts
  - o An overnight event for every new Cub Scout and his family.
  - o Take place in every district at the end of September/early October.
  - o Engages families and provides adventure early on in the Scouting experience.

While the district leadership organizes the School Nights, the Cub Scout pack leadership naturally plays a vital role.

**Cub Scout Pack's Role in School Night:**

- Assign a pack School Night Representative to communicate with the district School

**Night team.**

- Coordinate with the district leadership which elementary school the pack will participate at on School Night.
- Conduct a "Back to the Pack" summer meeting prior to School Night for all returning Cub Scouts (late July/early August).
- Communicate with the School Night Coordinator any unique needs/interests of the pack that School Night might help meet (prior to School Night).
- Participate in your district-wide School Night Kickoff (August).
- Ensure pack leadership attends School Night to receive applications and greet new leaders and new Cub Scouts!
