The City of Foster City has announced that the Senior Express Lunch Bunch Program will be reinstated for one year. The City of Foster City received a generous, anonymous donation of funds for the program which will continue to run in its entirety.

At the June 6, 2011 City Council meeting, City Council voted to reinstate the program.

Senior Express Bus Program

The Senior Express Bus operates as far north as Trousdale/Burlingame and as far south as Veterans Boulevard/Kaiser in San Bruno to Stanford Hospital and the Millbrae BART Station.

The Senior Express operates on Tuesdays from 9am-3:30pm and Wednesdays from 9am-5pm throughout the specified territory within Foster City and San Mateo.

Reservations are required and the payment method used or purchased at the Foster City Senior Wing from desk. To make reservations on Monday-Friday, between the hours of 9am and 1pm only, one day in advance.
