Pelot earns every merit badge

A Platte City Eagle Scout was honored for a rare achievement after earning every merit badge possible. Jonas Pelot, an Eagle Scout and sophomore at North Platte High School, earned 137 merit badges in total.

That includes all 135 merit badges currently offered by the Boy Scouts of America and two retired badges. It's a feat that has been accomplished less than 400 times in the history of the BSA.

Jonas was honored at a special ceremony on Wednesday, Nov. 20 at Platte City United Methodist Church.

Jonas is a member of Troop 1351 and in addition to attaining the rank of Eagle Scout, is also the recipient of the God and Church Award, World Conservation Award, 3 of the 4 STEM NOVA Awards and has earned 14 Eagle Scout Palms. For his Eagle Scout project, Jonas helped construct a platform that helped disabled riders at the Northland Therapeutic Riding Center.

The Eagle Scout Award is the highest rank attainable in the Boy Scouts of America. In 2018, 871 young men in the Kansas City metro area earned Scouting's highest rank — more than twice the national average.
