
## HISTORY OF ORDER OF THE ARROW IN CENTRAL & SOUTHERN IOWA



THE MEMBERS OF MITIGWALODGE

At the 1983 Lodge Banquet, held at Dowling High School on December 27, the Lodge presented the Arrowman of Achievement to four Brothers. They were adults Bill Darby, Jim Goodding, and Robert Trusty and the first youth member Barry Romitti. All three of these adults would serve as Lodge Adviser. Romitti served as Broken Arrow Chapter Chief and had attended the 1981 National Jamboree. Most interesting about Romitti was that he was the first Scout in the Mid-lowa Council to earn all the merit badges the Boy Scouts offered. He served on Camp Staff in 1984 and was a Philmont Ranger.





As the Lodge got ready for the summer of 1984, former Walnut Creek Chapter Chief and Vigil Honor member Paul Lewis introduced a small history book about the camp and the Lodge that was viewed as an excellent addition to the induction packet that each member received as they completed their Ordeal.

The Lodge funded the publishing of the book and gave one to each new member as well as offered them for sale in the Lodge Trading Post.


It included basic information on both Camp Mitigwa and Camp Wapello as well as some information about the Lodge's events and lists of Lodge Chiefs

Feb. 2, 2006

There was an open house to honor Brian Horn set for Feb. 5. Horn was hired to be the new superintendent for Madrid schools. He previously worked at Fairfield Middle School, and had been working in Madrid as the Director of Curriculum and Technology. Horn graduated college from Northern Iowa and got his PK-12 principal certification from Iowa State and followed that up with a superintendent certification program from UNI.

A town meeting was held for the new library. Library Board President Jonas Miller talked to 20 people who attended the meeting. The library cost was estimated at \$955,034 and the city had gotten about \$250,000 from taxes to go towards the project. The goal, Miller said, was to raise over \$700,000 over three years in private funding. Mary Holmes said they were applying for grant applications to go towards the library. City Administrator Keith Kudej answered a question about breaking ground for the new building. He thought the work could begin in the second year of the three year goal, thinking it could begin in 1998.

Norma L. Shepard was named the new vice president at Hawkeye Federal Savings Bank. Shepard, a Madrid resident, joined the bank in 1980 as a customer service representative at the Madrid branch. She has been dividing her time between the mortgage and installment loan departments in Boone along with branch manager responsibilities in Madrid.
